

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Walsh College's tuition is \$525.00 per semester credit hour for graduate courses and \$305.00 per semester credit hour for undergraduate courses. Textbooks, the \$125.00 per semester registration fee and the \$275.00 per semester international student fee are charged separately. The approximate cost for textbooks per class is \$100.00 - \$150.00.

A semester is 11 weeks: September-December (Fall Semester), January-March (Winter Semester), April-June (Spring Semester), and June-September (Summer Semester).

With your application, you must show evidence of sufficient financial support. Unfortunately, Federal and State financial aid is only available to American citizens and permanent residents. Academic scholarships are available to international students.

Sufficient financial support for Fall 2009 through Summer 2010, is a minimum of **\$25,442.00** for graduate level students and **\$27,944.00** for undergraduate level students for academic and living expenses. You are required to show support for the entire amount, even if you intend to live with relatives in the U.S.

Walsh College does not offer any type of assistantships. However, you may apply for on-campus student employment. Walsh College does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, or other school-administered programs. Opportunities are very limited, and you must submit a resume and be interviewed. Student employment is limited to a maximum of 20 hours per week, and may not be used towards required financial support. You must show financial support for the entire amount mentioned above.
