Stevenson University President **Kevin J. Manning** has retired "effective immediately" due to undisclosed "manageable health issues," according to the school. ...University of Montana President **Royce Engstrom** announced his resignation in late November. The unexpected message caught many in the university community off-guard. ...Fort Hays State University President **Mirta M. Martin** abruptly resigned at the end of November citing personal reasons. FHSU Vice President for Administration and Finance Mike Barnett will serve as acting president until an interim president is named. ...**Sara Ray Stoelinga**, director of the University of Chicago's Urban Education Institute and a clinical professor on the university's committee on education, has been appointed the 15th president of Carroll University, effective July 1, 2017. Stoelinga will replace president **Douglas Hastad**, who will retire June 30 after leading Carroll for more than a decade. ...Walsh College has appointed **Marsha Kelliher** as the school's seventh president and chief executive officer. Kelliher, dean of the Sigmund Weis School of Business at Susquehanna University in Pennsylvania, will begin her post at Walsh College in April 2017. She will succeed retiring President **Stephanie W. Bergeron**, who was appointed in 2007. ...Hastings College will start a new era next June as **Travis Fezell** becomes the College's 17th president. Fezell currently serves as Provost and Chief Academic Officer at University of the Ozarks. ...**James Earl Danieleley**, who led Elon College for 16 years and is credited with helping transform the school from a small, struggling college to what is now a nationally prominent university, has died at 92. ...Former Duke University President **Keith Brodie** passed away Dec. 2. He was 77. ...Former Elmira College President **Thomas K. Meier**, the second longest-tenured president in the school's history, has died. He was 76. ...**Max Lennon**, who served as the president of Clemson University from 1986 to 1994, died in late November. He was 76.
