

### 45 day CARES ACT Report - 2<sup>nd</sup> Report

- 1. Acknowledgement: Walsh College acknowledges that it signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement on April 13, 2020 and assures it intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Grants to students.
- 2. Total amount of funds Walsh College will or has received from the Department for Emergency Grants to Students: \$211,202
- 3. Total amount of Emergency Grants distributed to students as of report date: \$189,900
- 4. Estimated number of students at Walsh College eligible to receive Emergency Grants as of report date: 821
- 5. Total number of students who have received an Emergency Grant as of report date: 817
- 6. The method(s) used by Walsh College to determine which students receive Emergency Grant and how much under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act:

With guidance from the U.S. Department of Education, a committee collaborated with Walsh leadership to establish the following criteria:

#### Phase I Awards:

The first wave of awards was disbursed to eligible students who were enrolled in the Spring 2020 semester. These grants were automatic; no application process was necessary.

### Eligibility:

- Must meet Title IV Federal Aid eligibility criteria with a completed 2019-2020 FAFSA
- Must be enrolled in Spring 2020 semester in at least 1 credit hour
- Must not be enrolled in exclusively online program for the Spring 2020 semester

### Grants:

- Automatic grant (no application process)
- Distributed in the same manner as financial aid refunds
- Does not need to be repaid
- Students with an expected family contribution (EFC) less than 5577 granted \$300
- All other eligible students granted \$150

### Phase II Awards:

To be determined before December 31, 2020 for the remaining balance of funds.

Dear Students.

According to the requirements listed below, you may be eligible to receive funds through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to provide Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) emergency grants.

Emergency financial aid grants to students are intended to be used for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).

### Eligibility requirements:

- You must be eligible for Title IV federal funds.
- You must be enrolled in a degree program and taking at least one class for the Spring 2020 semester at the time of disbursement.
- You must have a validated FAFSA on file with Walsh's Financial Aid office.\*
- You must attend class regularly and be making satisfactory academic progress in accordance with Financial Aid.

If you do have a FAFSA on file, no additional action is required.

### Distribution of Funds

FAFSA eligible students with an "Expected Family Contribution less than 5577" will receive \$300.

All other FAFSA eligible students will receive \$150.

If you are signed up for non-payroll direct deposit by 8 a.m. on Monday, June 1, funds will be received in your bank account beginning on Wednesday, June 3.
